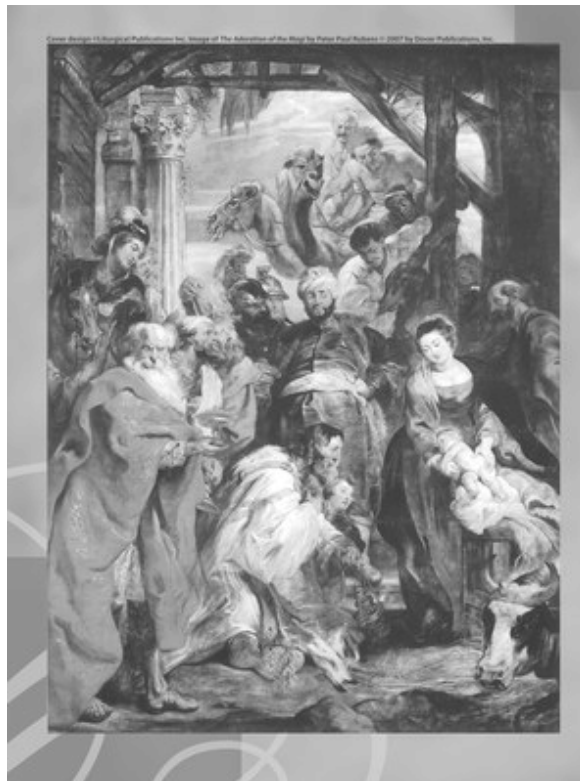

The All Boys' group (ages 8 to 12) will meet next Sat. from 2:30 to 4:30 pm in the school.

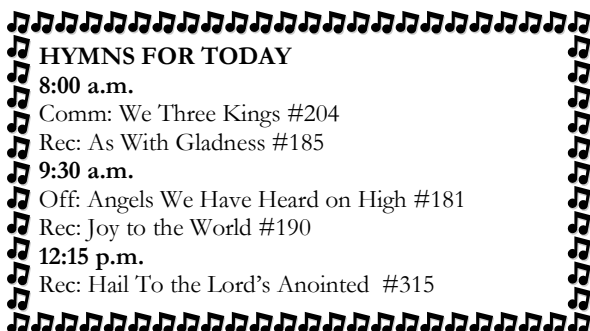
